Liberty Wins Top Honor at Art Show

AMSTERDAM- Liberty ARC's Liberty Through the Arts Program won first place at The New York State Association of Community and Residential Agencies' (NYSACRA) Art show held during their Annual Conference, this April.

A contemporary, three piece, sculpture named "The Three Sisters" was awarded the top prize out of more than 300 pieces of artwork from ARC's throughout the state. The sculptures were created by Mark Klug, Hester Livengood and Matt Novak.

These sculptures will be showcased in the Liberty/FM Community Garden, located on the grounds of Fulton Montgomery Community College. The garden was the inspiration for "The Three Sisters" and represents the three main agricultural crops of various Northern Native American tribes; winter squash, maize (corn), and climbing beans. These pieces were created with a quick drying cement and took several months to complete.

The Liberty Through the Arts program entered seven pieces of art work created by the artists supported by Liberty.

NYSACRA is a grassroots organization comprised of more than 200 provider agencies serving people with developmental disabilities and their families. As the largest association of this kind in New York State, our membership is our strength.
