Many of our patients are still experiencing negative effects of the pandemic, and this part of that. We are incredibly grateful to County Executive Matt Ossenfort, Chairman Robert Purtell, and the Montgomery County Legislature for supporting dental care for Montgomery County residents through this grant.'

With the closure of St. Peter's Health Partners dental clinic in Albany this past year, there are just a handful of clinics in the region that accept Medicaid dental insurance.

Many private dental practices do not accept the insurance as it costs more to perform the basic services than the payments reimburse. Grants like this one are vital to closing the fiscal gap that exists for operations like New Dimensions in Health Care's dental program, and ensures that high quality dental care can continue to be offered in Montgomery County to residents who rely on Medicaid. New Dimensions in Health Care offers a dental program that specializes in treating all pants, including those witl disabilities.

Participants will "Take a Hike" on the old Erie Canal Towpath from the Visitor Center to the Southside of Amsterdam.
