



Patrons can enter on the north side of the building (facing Route 5/Firehouse) through either the stairwell door or the reopened main floor handicap entrance

Additional resources can be discussed on a patron-by-patron basis, again please contact the front desk. The Children's Department may be unavailable due to construction in the attic and stairwell. We understand that parking is a challenge; and would like to remind patrons that there is additional parking available across the street at Riverfront Center. Additionally, we ask everyone to be careful and not to enter any of the clearly labeled, fenced construction zones.
